Project ECHO Opioid Use Disorder

Session-based module offerings:

- Expanding access to medication-assisted treatment (MAT)
- Opioids and pain identifying and reducing risk for OUD
- What is high-quality medication-assisted treatment (MAT)?

Building knowledge and practice

Through weekly, case-based TeleECHO sessions via Zoom videoconferencing or telephone, community providers are given the opportunity to share actual patient cases, participate in a collaborative discussion on the case and receive best practice guidance from an interdisciplinary team of specialists.

Each session includes a didactic presentation with a focus on MAT from the subject matter specialist followed by a collaborative discussion. This virtual knowledge-sharing network creates a learning loop:

- Sharing best practices to reduce disparities in MAT
- Applying case-based learning to master complexity
- Evaluating and monitoring outcomes
- Community providers learn from specialists
- · Community providers learn from each other
- Specialists learn from community providers as best practices emerge
