Potential high-dose opioid overutilization safety concerns

Effective July 10, 2017, the state of Louisiana will implement a maximum of 120 morphine milligram equivalents (MME) per day for members receiving short-acting and long-acting opioids given separately or together. This applies whether the opioids are given from the same prescriber or different prescribers. Prior authorization utilizing the *Opioid Analgesic Treatment Worksheet* will be required for doses greater than 120 MME per day.

In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, opioids are not first-line therapy for chronic pain outside of active cancer treatment, palliative care and end-of-life care. Evidence suggests that nonopioid treatments including nonopioid medications and nonpharmacological therapies can provide relief to those suffering from chronic pain. Studies also suggest that these treatments are safer.

This advance notice of implementation is given to encourage you to begin opioid downward titration now for chronic pain patients to less than a total of 120 MME per day to avoid opioid claims rejecting at the point of sale on or after the implementation date.
